Introduction

Within our school, we promote an atmosphere that encourages effort, enjoyment and a celebration of the achievements of all our pupils. Pupils wearing school uniform also reflects the pride they take in our school and the feeling of belonging it creates.

It is our school policy that **all children are required to wear** the official school uniform when attending our school or when participating in a school organised event outside of normal school hours.

The uniform also underpins our school ethos and in electing to come to Hollinsclough CE Academy; parents agree to support this approach.

Aims

Our approach is based on the belief that wearing a school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of pride in our school and thereby has a positive impact on behaviour and attitude
- Develops a sense of community and belonging to our school
- Identifies children with our school when taking part in out of school educational activities and visits
- Is practical and looks smart
- Makes children feel equal to others in terms of appearance
- Is regarded as suitable wear for school and is value for money

School Uniform

Please reduce the risk of loss by ensuring that every item of clothing (including coats and footwear) is clearly marked with your child's name.

The school will not accept any responsibility for misplaced clothing. However, if clothing is clearly marked, we will endeavour to seek out lost items.

Our school colours are Dark Blue and Yellow and consists of the following:

Girls and Boys

- Logoed Yellow Polo Shirt
- Logoed Blue Sweatshirt /Jumper
- Logoed Blue Cardigan
- Optional – Logoed Fleece, Hoodie, school coat
- Grey / Black Trousers, Skirt/leggings,
- Black shorts/leggings/jog bottoms for PE
- Logoed white PE T-Shirt

Girls - Plain black or grey tights and/or white socks

Summer Option: Yellow/White checked dress

Boys – Black/Grey socks

Footwear ALL pupils – Black shoes only, for PE Trainers, strongly recommended – Walking Boots, wellington boots

Recommended – warm winter coat (logoed school coat available), a lightweight waterproof coat for autumn/spring. Waterproof trousers these could be lined for winter or lightweight for autumn/spring.

Pre-owned items

Items of good quality, pre-owned uniform may be available for purchase. Please ask the office for information.

We also welcome donations of clean pre-owned items which if sold, will see the proceedings go to the PTA fund only.
